## Program Overview

Eufaula HIPPIY was granted permission to implement a pilot program serving 25 children during the 2008-2009 HIPPIY year. This pilot was only for the first year of the program. This exception has been granted to allow our HIPPIY program to become established in the community. We are expected to continue to seek adequate funding that will allow us to expand and be able to provide services to additional children adding more families each year.

Our HIPPIY program currently serves 25 families. Eufaula HIPPIY program has been successful in building relationships with our families, the retention rate for families has been about 90%, and retention rate for parent educators is 100%.

The Coordinator was hired in September, 2008 to coordinate the implementation of the Home Instruction Program for Preschool Youngsters (HIPPIY) program as outlined in the HIPPIY USA Manual. October, 2008, Dr. Sadler signed an operating agreement between HIPPIY USA and Eufaula City Schools. In November, the on-site training for the coordinator and 2 parent educators was conducted by the national trainer. Thereafter, the parent educators began enrolling families in the program and pre-testing the children. HIPPIY Eufaula is looking forward to expanding the program and to all the wonderful things that are yet to come.
